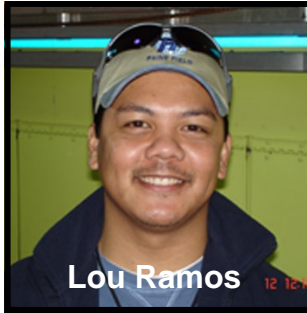

2007 MARCH FOR HUNGER FOOD DRIVE

The County, Airport and the Volunteers of America (VOA) are working together to collect non-perishable food and cash donations to help feed the hungry in our region.
