Aircraft Rescue Fire Fighting (ARFF) Training



For the past five years, Boeing has sponsored an "Aircraft Construction and Familiarization Seminar" through the ARFF Working Group. The purpose is to train Airport firefighters specifically on Boeing aircraft. On April 6th, six Airport and six Boeing firefighters welcomed 26 firefighters from throughout the United States, Denmark and Canada and provided a day of training at Kilo 5/6. The firefighters did approaches and attacks with the crash trucks, hand line operations, search and rescue inside the aircraft and ladder operations on the aircraft (using our 727). They also had actual aircraft skins (shells) to cut on with a variety of cutting tools. There is an "annual live fire" requirement that was satisfied with the training held here at the *Airport of Choice!*
