Paine Field Fire Fighters Fight Edmonds Fire

The Airport Fire Department recently assisted the Edmonds Fire Department in suppressing a fully involved fire at a storage unit, with 63 individual compartments.

The storage units were filled solid with household materials, making the extinguishment almost impossible without physically removing the contents. After three hours of battling the blaze, Paine Field's help was requested with the hope that a large amount of foam in a short amount of time would bring the fire to a manageable state.

The crew of Captain Rueter, Firefighter Bales and Mace responded and were successful. The Foam Unit drove down both sides of the building, using the bumper turret at 90 degrees and applied foam in each of the units. A total of 180 gallons of foam and 6,000 gallons of water accomplished the mission.

This was another great opportunity for the Airport to assist in a situation where the Foam Unit was really the right piece of equipment for the problem and provided an opportunity to re-pay other fire departments for the mutual support provided to Paine Field.
